

# Third Space Learning Terms of Service (United States)

## 1. Who we are

We are Third Space Learning Inc., registered in Delaware under EIN 30-1336140, and with our registered office address at Third Space Learning Inc., 3 Germay Dr, Unit 4 #2810, Wilmington, DE 19804 (referred to as “we” and “us”).

## 2. The Services we provide

We provide a proprietary online education platform for use by schools and school districts to assist with student development and learning by providing access to personalized teaching by connecting students with a spoken AI math tutor called Skye (“AI Tutor”) that communicates with the student in a secure online classroom. We also provide free math resources that can be downloaded by teachers and parents. Collectively these services are referred to as the “Services”. The Services are provided via our website, the URL of which is <https://thirdspacelearning.com/us/>

**THESE TERMS OF SERVICE ALONG WITH OUR PRIVACY POLICY SET FORTH THE LEGALLY BINDING TERMS AND CONDITIONS THAT GOVERN YOUR USE OF OUR SERVICES.** These are only applicable to users in the United States. For terms applicable to users outside the United States, please view our [terms of service here](#).

In ordering or registering to receive the Services from us, you enter into an agreement with us on the basis of these terms (referred to as the “agreement”). This agreement to provide the Services is between us and you, and you are responsible for ensuring that the Services are used in accordance with this agreement. You may only use the Services on the basis of this agreement. By using the Services, you are accepting these terms (on behalf of yourself or any entity that you represent), and you represent and warrant that you have the right, authority, and capacity to enter into these terms (on behalf of yourself or the entity that you represent).

**Order of precedence. Where you have entered into a signed written agreement, order form, master services agreement or data privacy agreement with Third Space Learning, that document governs to the extent of any conflict with these Terms of Service. These Terms otherwise apply to your use of the Services.**

Where you are a school or school district customer (or a user authorized by one), your access to the Services is governed by your agreement with us, and the school or district administers and controls the relevant accounts and settings including provisioning and de-provisioning access, managing permissions, configuring privacy-related settings, and accessing the data and account contents of its authorized users. In the event of any conflict between these Terms and the school or district’s signed agreement with us, that signed agreement controls.

AI transparency and oversight. The AI Tutor Skye is an artificial-intelligence system that supplements, and does not replace, classroom instruction. Tutoring sessions are supervised by school staff and supported by our safeguarding monitoring. AI-generated responses may occasionally be inaccurate or

incomplete. We do not use the Services to make automated decisions that produce legal or similarly significant effects about a student, and student data is not used to train third-party AI models (see our [Privacy Policy](#)).

**YOU MAY NOT USE THE SERVICES OR ACCEPT THE TERMS IF YOU ARE NOT AT LEAST 13 YEARS OLD UNLESS YOUR PARENT(S) OR GUARDIAN(S) HAVE PROVIDED THE NECESSARY CONSENT. IF YOU DO NOT AGREE WITH ALL OF THE PROVISIONS OF THESE TERMS, DO NOT USE THE SERVICES. IF YOU ARE A TEACHER OR OTHER SCHOOL/DISTRICT OFFICIAL, YOU MUST OBTAIN ALL NECESSARY PARENTAL CONSENTS BEFORE ALLOWING STUDENTS TO USE THE SERVICES.**

**THESE TERMS REQUIRE THE USE OF ARBITRATION ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS TO RESOLVE DISPUTES, RATHER THAN JURY TRIALS OR CLASS ACTIONS, AND ALSO LIMIT THE REMEDIES AVAILABLE TO YOU IN THE EVENT OF A DISPUTE (SUBJECT TO THE PUBLIC-DISTRICT CARVE-OUT AND THE 30-DAY OPT-OUT IN SECTION 23).**

### **3. What the Services include**

The Services include:

- (a) the free resources available for download from our website;
- (b) the facility for schools or schools district personnel to book online tutoring sessions for students (each referred to as a “session”);
- (c) the provision of sessions to students in accordance with bookings made by schools or school district personnel; and
- (d) the provision of tools and reports that enable schools and school districts to analyze assessment and attainment data for students as well as groups of students to determine patterns and trends that may be evident.

New facilities may be added by us to the Services from time to time, in which case the Services will be treated as including those new facilities accordingly and you will be provided with access to them (subject to any additional terms applying to the use of the new facilities concerned).

#### **Recording disclosure**

You acknowledge and agree that:

- (a) tutoring sessions conducted through or in connection with the Services may be recorded and that any such recordings may capture audio and on-screen interactions between participants in such sessions as well as other personal information concerning such participants (“Recorded Sessions”), and
- (b) Recorded Sessions and related personal information and data such as transcriptions of such Recorded Sessions may be shared with researchers for purposes of performing educational studies.

These recordings are used to:

- (a) provide and improve the Services - in particular, live transcription is vital for the AI tutor to be able to communicate in real-time with any student.

- (b) ensure security and compliance - recordings allow us to run a robust safeguarding system to allow us to monitor any disclosures.

Recordings and transcripts are never used to advertise or market to students or families, and are handled in accordance with our Privacy Policy.

For the avoidance of doubt, no video element of a student's face or likeness is captured as the student works through a shared whiteboard and an audio connection with their AI tutor.

Please review our privacy policy to learn more about how Third Space Learning handles your personal information, including any personal information associated with recordings of tutoring sessions.

#### **4. Who may use the Services**

The only people who may use the Services (each referred to as a "user") are:

- (a) individuals over 13 who access free resources ("Free Resource User");
- (b) school or district employees authorized to act on behalf of the school or school district ("School User");
- (c) teachers or other school employees who have been registered and authorized by a school or school district we contract with to use the Services but are not authorized to act on behalf of the school or school district as a whole ("Staff User"); and
- (d) students who have been registered and authorized by a school or school district we contract with ("Student User").

#### **5. Who may not use the Services**

Free resources are targeted at teachers and not intended for individuals under the age of 13. If we become aware that an individual under 13 is attempting to access our free resources, we will restrict their ability to download resources.

For tutoring, only people who are authorized by the school may use the Services. After a Staff User or Student User leaves a school, the School User must make sure to cancel any registration that they may have to use the Services, and they may no longer use the Services. We are not liable or responsible for any unauthorized access to a school's account by any Staff User or Student User because the school failed to cancel their registration.

#### **6. Arrangements for use of the Services**

In order for you to use the free resources Services:

- (a) You must enter your email address and job title.
- (b) You may be required to enter the state where you are located.

In order to use the tutoring Services on behalf of a school or school district:

- (a) You must place an order with us to purchase and agree to pay for a subscription in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

- (b) You must set up an account for each user you wish to access the Services. There are two types of accounts, accounts for students (Student Accounts), and accounts for teachers and district staff (Staff Accounts). Each account must be connected to a single user. For Staff Accounts, you must provide the user's first name, last name, a valid school email address (which can be used as the user's username for the purpose of accessing the Services) and any other information specified as being mandatory by us in order to complete the sign-up process. For Student Accounts, you must provide the user's first name, last name, grade level, a password and any other information specified as being mandatory by us in order to complete the sign-up process.
- (c) You must ensure that the relevant students attend each session using their own accounts.
- (d) You must ensure that all sessions are supervised by a member of staff at the school or district.
- (e) You must ensure that you are authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of your school/school district.

In order to use the tutoring Services as a teacher or student:

- (a) Your school must place an order with us to purchase a subscription and agree to pay for the subscription.
- (b) You will need to register for the Services before you can use it for the first time.
- (c) Your school must set up an account for you to access the Services.

In order to request marketing materials:

- (a) You must provide your name, email, and state.

You understand that the Services are evolving as we continue to develop and improve Services. You acknowledge and agree that Third Space Learning may update the Services with or without notifying you. You may need to update third-party software from time to time in order to use the Services. Any future release, update or other addition to the Services shall be subject to these terms of service.

## **7. Limited Contact; Advertising**

Through your use of the Services, we may contact you via email or phone to send you information about the Services including, without limitation, about changes to this agreement or our Privacy Policy, new features, and other information helpful or appropriate to the use of the Services. Third Space Learning contacts will never request personal information such as social security numbers, credit card numbers, or other personal information. We will only contact our users to advertise to them if they have not opted-out of such communications. We will not contact students for advertising purposes.

You are not required to consent to receive advertising or promotional communications as a condition of using the Services, and you may opt out of them at any time using the unsubscribe link in our emails.

## **8. Things you must ensure in relation to your use of the Services**

If applicable to how you access our Services, you must ensure that:

- (i) (a) All tutoring Services are supervised by a member of staff at the school. This staff member should be present to support students in the event that the student needs any technical or other support.
  - (b) usernames and passwords are entered correctly to gain access to the Services;
  - (c) users do not share their username and passwords;
  - (d) information technology set up and guidance provided by us has been followed, completed and tested by the school prior to the relevant start date and thereafter throughout the provision of the Services;
  - (e) information technology and online quick tip help functions are followed so that each session is successfully launched and completed;
  - (f) all local computers and headsets to be used for each session are operating properly including all operating systems, network connections and/or ISP connectivity;
  - (g) teachers' quick tips are followed to ensure a full and proper learning experience for students and the AI Tutor. This includes creating a complete profile as required for each student and, if the school or school district has opted for a teacher selection program, the prompt and timely selection of courses and learning outcomes to allow tutors to conduct sessions effectively; and
- (ii) (a) All sessions are attended by the students for whom the relevant sessions have been arranged (to the best of your ability - eg. if a student is absent from school then they reasonably cannot attend).
  - (b) Ensure that users maintain the security of their account login information, including their username and password ("credentials"). We are entitled to assume that any use of the Services involving use of any credentials allocated to any of your users is in use by the users concerned, and you will be liable to us accordingly. Anyone using the Services who inputs valid School User or Staff User credentials will be assumed by us to be authorized to book, reschedule and/or cancel sessions, whether or not they are actually authorized by you to do so.
  - (c) Notify us immediately if you have any reason to believe that the secrecy or security of any user's credentials has been compromised.
  - (d) Ensure that you and the users under your control, if applicable, comply with the terms of this agreement and that users do not access or use the Services otherwise than in accordance with the terms of this agreement, including the Acceptable Use Policy.
  - (e) Ensure that you and users under your control, if applicable, use the Services in a reasonable and appropriate manner, and do not use the Services for any illegal or unlawful purpose as further explained below in the Acceptable Use Policy.

### **Acceptable Use Policy:**

The following terms constitute our "Acceptable Use Policy":

- (a) You agree not to use the Services to collect, upload, transmit, display, or distribute any user content (any and all information and content that a user submits to, or uses with, the Services (e.g., content in the user's profile or postings))
  - (i) that violates any third-party right, including any copyright, trademark, patent, trade secret, moral right, privacy right, right of publicity, or any other intellectual property or proprietary right;

- (ii) that is unlawful, harassing, abusive, tortious, threatening, harmful, invasive of another's privacy, vulgar, defamatory, false, intentionally misleading, trade libelous, pornographic, obscene, patently offensive, promotes racism, bigotry, hatred, or physical harm of any kind against any group or individual or is otherwise objectionable;
- (iii) that is harmful to minors in any way; or
- (iv) that is in violation of any law, regulation, or obligations or restrictions imposed by any third party.

(b) In addition, you agree not to:

- (i) upload, transmit, or distribute to or through the Services any computer viruses, worms, or any software intended to damage or alter a computer system or data;
- (ii) send through the Services unsolicited or unauthorized advertising, promotional materials, junk mail, spam, chain letters, pyramid schemes, or any other form of duplicative or unsolicited messages, whether commercial or otherwise;
- (iii) use the Services to harvest, collect, gather or assemble information or data regarding other users, including e-mail addresses, without their consent;
- (iv) interfere with, disrupt, or create an undue burden on servers or networks connected to the Services, or violate the regulations, policies or procedures of such networks;
- (v) attempt to gain unauthorized access to our Services (or to other computer systems or networks connected to or used together with the Services), whether through password mining or any other means;
- (vi) harass or interfere with any other user's use and enjoyment of the Services; or
- (vii) use software or automated agents or scripts to produce multiple accounts on the Services, or to generate automated searches, requests, or queries to (or to strip, scrape, or mine data from) our Services (provided, however, that we conditionally grant to the operators of public search engines revocable permission to use spiders to copy materials from the Services for the sole purpose of and solely to the extent necessary for creating publicly available searchable indices of the materials, but not caches or archives of such materials, subject to the parameters set forth in our robots.txt file).

### **Enforcement:**

We reserve the right (but have no obligation) to review any user content, and to investigate and/or take appropriate action against you in our sole discretion if you violate the Acceptable Use Policy or any other provision of these Terms or otherwise create liability for us or any other person. Such action may include removing or modifying your user content, terminating your account, and/or reporting you to law enforcement authorities.

### **Use by Children Under 13:**

The Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA") requires that all online service providers, including Third Space Learning, obtain parental consent before knowingly collecting personally identifiable information from children under the age of 13. If you are a School User or Staff User, you must obtain all necessary parental consents before allowing students to use the services.

- (a) For free resources: We do not knowingly collect or solicit any personally identifiable information from children under the age of 13. People under the age of 13 are prohibited from accessing free resources. If we learn that we have collected personal information from a person under the age

of 13 that does not comply with COPPA, we will delete that information as soon as reasonably practicable. If you believe that a child under the age of 13 has provided personally identifiable information to us without the necessary consent, please contact us as soon as possible at [hello@thirdspacelearning.com](mailto:hello@thirdspacelearning.com).

- (b) For tutoring: Children under the age of 13 are prohibited from using the Services or creating an account unless they are doing so with parental consent or with the consent of a teacher, school, or district who is providing such consent in compliance with COPPA. If we learn that we have collected personal information from a person under the age of 13 that does not comply with COPPA, we will delete that information in a reasonably prudent amount of time. ### Other Users:

We will use our reasonable endeavors to make the tutoring Services available during school hours throughout each relevant school semester of the subscription you have purchased. We may suspend access for maintenance/improvements with prior notice where possible, without liability for brief interruptions. Access to the service may be temporarily suspended for maintenance or system improvements. We will provide prior notice of such suspensions where feasible. We shall not be held liable for brief interruptions of service including when these happen without notice.

## **Accessibility:**

Third Space Learning is committed to ensuring that the Services remain accessible to all individuals, regardless of disability. We will take reasonable steps to ensure that the Services meet customary standards for accessibility and comply with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (“ADA”), as applicable. You acknowledge and agree that we will have no obligation to provide you with any support or maintenance in connection with the Services. However, and without any obligation whatsoever, we will try to use commercially reasonable methods designed to ensure that the Services are free of material errors. We do not guarantee that the Services or any given session will be available continuously or at any given time or that its use will be entirely uninterrupted or error-free. For the avoidance of doubt, this support commitment also applies to schools and districts taking part in a paid or sponsored pilot of the Services.

## **11. Fees**

### **For Schools/School Districts**

Fees for Tutoring Services are payable by the school or school district with respect to the subscription ordered by the school. Unless expressly agreed otherwise, all fees will be calculated and paid in U.S. dollars, and all fees are subject to the applicable sales taxes which shall be paid by the school. The fees for the subscription, excluding sales tax, are set out in the order confirmation for the school. We will invoice the school or school district the fees for the subscription purchased no earlier than 30 days before the start date of the subscription.

Invoices must, unless otherwise agreed in writing by us, be paid in full 21 days after the date of the invoice.

Should a purchase order number be required on the invoice, the purchase order number for the subscription be emailed to [finance@thirdspacelearning.com](mailto:finance@thirdspacelearning.com) no later than 7 days after receipt of the order confirmation.

We may increase our fees at any time but this will not affect the fees charged for any subscription contracted for on an order confirmation dated before the date on which any notice of increase given to the school or school district comes into effect as fees for each subscription once booked remain fixed for the duration of the subscription concerned. All fees are non-refundable except to the extent that we expressly and specifically agree otherwise.

Any increase to the fees applying to a Renewal Term will be notified to the school or district at least thirty (30) days before the renewal date.

Where this agreement is terminated by the school or district for our uncured material breach, we will refund any prepaid fees for Services not yet delivered as at the date of termination.

### **Free Trial for Schools/School Districts**

If a school or school district is offered and signs up for a free trial period to our Services, we will make the Services available to the school or school district on such a basis (that is, non-paid for access) until the earlier of either:

- (a) the expiration of the free trial period for which the school or school district has subscribed; or
- (b) the commencement date of any paid for Services requested by the school or school district.

The school or school district's access to the Services will be suspended/terminated immediately on expiration of the free trial period for which it has subscribed. Where the school or school district wishes to continue using the Services, it must contact Third Space Learning prior to the expiration of the free trial period to guarantee uninterrupted and continuous access to, and use of, the Services.

### **For End Users**

Currently, there are no fees payable directly by end users of our Services (Free Resource Users, Staff Users, and Student Users). If we decide to change our fees policy, we will provide thirty (30) days' notice to all end users.

## **12. Warranties**

We warrant that:

The school or district retains direct control over the use and maintenance of those records; we use them only to provide the Services and for no other purpose; and we will not re-disclose them except as permitted by the school or district or as required by law.

COPPA - For students under 13, Third Space Learning relies on the consent of the school or district under COPPA's school-consent exception, as described in the Privacy Policy. The school or district is responsible for obtaining any parental consent its own policies require.

Recordings and transcripts - Session recordings and transcripts are used only to deliver, support, secure and improve the Services and to meet our child-safeguarding obligations. They are stored in the United States, are not used to train third-party AI models, and are protected by administrative,

technical and physical safeguards including encryption in transit and at rest. No video of a student's face or likeness is captured.

Data retention - Student personal data, recordings and transcripts are retained in accordance with the Data Classification and Retention Schedule set out in our Privacy Policy, and are deleted or de-identified on the timelines stated there (or earlier where a signed district agreement so requires).

Data privacy agreement - On request, Third Space Learning will enter into a data privacy agreement with the school or district, including a state-specific exhibit or the SDPC National Data Privacy Agreement where applicable. Where a signed data privacy agreement conflicts with these Terms in respect of student data, the data privacy agreement governs.

Security and breach notification - We maintain a documented information-security program and will notify the affected school or district of any breach of security involving student data without undue delay, and within any shorter period required by a signed agreement or applicable state law.

Documentation - FERPA/COPPA compliance information, our sub-processor list, and a summary of our security controls are available to schools and districts on request.

Ownership of data - As between the parties, the school or district (or the student or parent, as applicable) owns all student data, recordings, transcripts and student-generated content. Third Space Learning obtains no ownership rights in student data and will use it only to provide the Services and as permitted by this agreement and the Privacy Policy.

No sale of data - We do not sell student data and do not use it for third-party advertising or to build non-educational profiles of students.

Sub-processors - We use the sub-processors listed in our published sub-processor list to help deliver the Services and we remain responsible for their compliance with this agreement; the current list is available on request and published in our Data Protection & Privacy Policy.

## **17. Confidentiality**

We will keep confidential any confidential information which you provide to us in connection with the Services and you will do the same in relation to any confidential information which we provide to you. Confidential information will include all information marked as being confidential and any other information which ought reasonably to be assumed to be confidential. The obligations as to confidentiality set out above will not apply to any information to the extent that it is:

- (a) Available to the public other than because of any breach of this agreement or other obligation of confidentiality.
- (b) When it is supplied, already known to whomever it is disclosed to in circumstances in which they are not prevented from disclosing it to others.
- (c) Independently obtained by whomever it is disclosed to in circumstances in which they are not prevented from disclosing it to others.

- (d) Required to be disclosed by law or by any court or tribunal with proper authority to order its disclosure.

We may disclose your confidential information to any sub-contractors of ours who need to have access to it in order to carry out any obligations that are sub-contracted to them, but in that case we will ensure that the relevant sub-contractor enters into confidentiality obligations with us on substantially the same terms as in this agreement.

Student personal data and education records are treated as your confidential information regardless of whether they are marked as confidential.

## **18. Renewal, term, and termination**

The agreement under which we provide the Services will come into effect (a) for free resources, when you provide your information to download a resource or (b) for tutoring, the earlier of you registering to receive the Services, the date indicated on the order form, or the date on which an order confirmation is sent, or a contract is signed (whichever is earliest) and will remain in full force and effect while you use the Services.

The subscription and service will begin on the date indicated on the order form, order confirmation, or contract (“Subscription Start Date”). The service runs from the Subscription Start Date for the number of months specified on the Order Form (the “Initial Term”). At the end of the Initial Term, your subscription will automatically renew for further periods equal to the Initial Term (each a “Renewal Term”) unless either party gives notice of termination before the relevant renewal date. We will provide reminders and notifications before any renewal. You may provide notice or opt-out of auto-renewal when purchasing your Initial Term. If no timely notice is given, the Agreement continues as a rolling contract on the same package and for the same duration as the Initial Term.

If you opt-out of auto-renewal when purchasing your Initial Term, you will be on a Fixed-Term Contract with a defined start and end date - all contracts are annual, or multi-year. We will provide reminders about renewal and your School Program Manager will discuss options with you for continuing on another contract.

The Agreement ends once: (a) all obligations under the Initial Term and any Renewal Terms have been met, or (b) all obligations under the Fixed-Term Contract have been met, or (c) it is earlier terminated in accordance with this clause.

We may suspend or terminate your rights to use the Services (including your account) at any time for any reason at our sole discretion (which, for school and school district customers, is qualified by the notice and protection provisions set out below), including for any use of the Services in violation of this agreement. Upon termination of your rights under this agreement, your account and right to access and use the Services will terminate immediately. You understand that any termination of your account may involve deletion of your user content associated with your account from our live databases. When your account has been terminated, you are not entitled to a restoration of your account or any of your user content. Third Space Learning will not have any liability whatsoever to you for any termination of

your rights under this agreement, including for termination of your account or deletion of your user content, except for a termination by Third Space Learning that is in breach of this clause.

### **School and School District Customers - Suspension and Termination Protections**

Notwithstanding the foregoing, for school and school district customers: (i) we will not terminate this agreement or a school or district's access for convenience without at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice; (ii) we will suspend access only (a) for non-payment that remains uncured 14 days after written notice, (b) for a material breach that remains uncured during the cure period set out below, (c) where reasonably necessary to address a security, safeguarding or legal risk, or (d) as required by law; and (iii) any suspension will be limited in scope and duration to addressing the relevant issue, with notice provided as soon as reasonably practicable. On termination or expiry, we will, at the school or district's election, return or delete student data in accordance with the Privacy Policy's retention schedule and any signed data privacy agreement.

### **Additional Termination Options for Schools/School Districts:**

Access for a school/school district and its associated users will be automatically canceled upon the completion of the subscription that the school or school district has purchased unless another subscription has been purchased. Notwithstanding this, the agreement may be terminated as follows:

- (a) Either the School User or we may terminate this agreement immediately by notice to the other:
  - (i) if the other has committed a material breach of this agreement and (in the case of a breach capable of remedy) has failed to remedy the breach within 30 days of being requested to do so by the party not in breach; or
  - (ii) if the other is subject to an insolvency event.

School Users are responsible for ensuring data of Staff Users and Student Users are deleted when either type of user is no longer associated with the school or school district. If the contract with a school or school district is terminated, user accounts associated with that school will be terminated.

### **Deletion of Sensitive Information Upon Termination:**

Upon termination of your account, you may request that we delete any sensitive information from our live databases and we agree to take commercially reasonable steps to honor such requests in a reasonable amount of time not to exceed ninety (90) days. You understand and agree that we may continue to have sensitive information in archive files or similar databases. You further agree that we have no obligation to delete aggregated or de-identified information. We may retain and use aggregated and de-identified information for any purpose that is consistent with applicable federal and state laws and regulations.

Before any deletion of student data on termination or expiry, we will, on request, give the school or district a reasonable opportunity to export its data in a commonly used format.

### **Survival**

Termination or expiry of this agreement does not affect any rights, obligations or liabilities of either party that accrued before termination, and the following provisions survive termination or expiry: Sections 13 to 17 (license, intellectual property, data protection and confidentiality), the data-deletion and data-export provisions of this Section 18, Section 19 (liability and indemnification), and Sections 20, 22 and 23.

## 19. Liability

### Release

You hereby release and forever discharge Third Space Learning (and its corporate parents, subsidiaries, officers, employees, agents, successors, and assigns) from, and hereby waive and relinquish, each and every past, present and future dispute, claim, controversy, demand, right, obligation, liability, action and cause of action of every kind and nature that has arisen or arises directly or indirectly out of, or that relates directly or indirectly to, the Services (including any interactions with, or act or omission of, other Service users or any Third-Party Links & Ads). This release does not apply to, and you do not waive, any claim for personal injury or death, or any claim arising from Third Space Learning's own gross negligence, willful misconduct, breach of its data-protection, privacy or confidentiality obligations, or its indemnification obligations under this agreement. The release also does not apply to any claim for fraud, intentional misrepresentation, or any unconscionable commercial practice by Third Space Learning.

### Indemnification

You agree to indemnify and hold Third Space Learning (and its corporate parents, subsidiaries, officers, employees, and agents) harmless, including costs and attorneys' fees, from any claim or demand made by any third party due to or arising out of (a) your use of the Services, (b) your violation of this agreement, (c) your violation of applicable laws or regulations or (d) your user content, except to the extent the claim arises from Third Space Learning's own negligence, willful misconduct or breach of this agreement. We reserve the right, at your expense, to assume the exclusive defense and control of any matter for which you are required to indemnify us, and you agree to cooperate with our defense of these claims. You agree not to settle any matter without the prior written consent of Third Space Learning. We will use reasonable efforts to notify you of any such claim, action or proceeding upon becoming aware of it.

Indemnification by Third Space Learning. Third Space Learning will indemnify and hold the school or district (and its officers, employees and agents) harmless, including reasonable costs and attorneys' fees, from any third-party claim arising out of (a) our breach of this agreement, (b) our violation of applicable law, (c) our infringement of a third party's intellectual-property rights (as further set out in Section 15), or (d) a breach of our data-protection, privacy or data-security obligations that compromises student data. The same procedural conditions set out above (prompt notice, cooperation, and control of the defense) apply reciprocally.

### Limitation on Liability

**TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, IN NO EVENT SHALL THIRD SPACE LEARNING (OR OUR CORPORATE PARENTS, SUBSIDIARIES, OR SUPPLIERS) BE LIABLE TO YOU OR ANY THIRD PARTY FOR ANY LOST PROFITS, LOST DATA, COSTS OF PROCUREMENT OF SUBSTITUTE PRODUCTS, OR ANY INDIRECT, CONSEQUENTIAL, EXEMPLARY, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES ARISING FROM OR RELATING TO THESE TERMS OR YOUR USE OF, OR INABILITY TO USE, THE SERVICES, EVEN IF WE HAVE BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.**

**TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, OUR LIABILITY TO YOU FOR ANY DAMAGES ARISING FROM OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT WILL AT ALL TIMES BE LIMITED TO THE GREATER OF THE AMOUNT PAID BY YOU DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS PRIOR TO THE DATE ON WHICH THE CLAIM AROSE OR FIFTY US DOLLARS (U.S. \$50). THE EXISTENCE OF MORE THAN ONE CLAIM WILL NOT ENLARGE THIS LIMIT. SOME JURISDICTIONS DO NOT ALLOW THE LIMITATION OR EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY FOR INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, SO THE ABOVE LIMITATION OR EXCLUSION MAY NOT APPLY TO YOU.**

Exceptions to the limitations. The exclusions and the monetary cap in this Section do not apply to: (i) either party's indemnification obligations under this agreement; (ii) a party's breach of its confidentiality obligations; (iii) Third Space Learning's breach of its data-protection, privacy or data-security obligations, including reasonable costs of breach notification, credit monitoring and remediation arising from a security breach caused by us; or (iv) a party's gross negligence or willful misconduct.

### **Insurance**

Third Space Learning maintains commercially appropriate insurance for a business of its size and nature, including cyber/privacy liability and general/professional liability coverage. Certificates of insurance are available to schools and districts on request.

## **20. Miscellaneous terms**

In relation to this agreement: We may sub-contract the performance of any of our obligations, but we will remain responsible to you under this agreement for performance of the obligations concerned in accordance with the terms of this agreement. You may not assign your rights under this agreement without our prior consent (not to be unreasonably withheld). Neither you nor we will be liable for any breach of this agreement (other than in relation to obligations as to payment) arising due to circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the party concerned.

Copyright / Trademark Information: Copyright © 2026 Third Space Learning. All rights reserved. All trademarks, logos and service marks ("Marks") displayed on the Site are our property or the property of other third parties. You are not permitted to use these Marks without our prior written consent or the consent of such a third party which may own the Marks.

Assignment on a change of control. We may assign this agreement to an affiliate or to a successor in connection with a merger, acquisition or sale of substantially all of our assets, provided that the successor agrees in writing to be bound by these Terms and any signed data privacy agreement, and that student data will not be sold as part of, or transferred without equivalent protections in, any such transaction.

Notices. Formal notices under this agreement must be in writing. Notices to us must be sent to the postal or email address set out in Section 24; notices to you may be sent to the contact details associated with your account or order. Notices are deemed given on delivery (or, for email, when sent, in the absence of a delivery-failure message).

Feedback. If you give us feedback or suggestions about the Services, we may use them without restriction and without any obligation to you, and you grant us a perpetual, royalty-free license to use them. We will treat feedback as non-confidential.

Export control. You agree to comply with all applicable U.S. export-control and economic-sanctions laws in connection with your use of the Services.

## 21. Fair Usage Policy

The Service is priced on the assumption of reasonable, human-driven use. This clause safeguards the platform against automated or excessive activity (e.g., bot-generated bookings) and helps keep programme costs sustainable for every school.

- (a) For each “School Year” (1 August to 31 July) the Customer may attend up to 7,000 tutoring sessions without additional restriction (“Fair-Usage Threshold”). Exceeding this figure would require booking over 200 sessions every teaching week - approximately ten times the tutoring volume delivered by a typical school using traditional human tutoring - so the threshold should rarely be reached.
- (b) Usage is monitored continuously. If the Customer’s attended sessions approach, or are reasonably forecast to exceed, the Fair-Usage Threshold, the Customer’s Program Manager will contact the school to agree a plan for the remainder of the School Year.
- (c) Where the Customer’s usage is likely to considerably exceed the Fair-Usage Threshold and the parties cannot agree a mutually acceptable plan, Third Space Learning reserves the right (on at least 7 days’ written notice) to restrict the number of further sessions that may be booked and/or attended until the earlier of the start of the next School Year (i.e., renewal date); or the parties agreeing in writing to purchase additional capacity. Any restriction will be proportionate to the excess usage forecast.
- (d) Counting Rules. An “attended session” means a scheduled or on-demand tutoring session in which at least one pupil joins for any part of the allotted time. Cancelled or unattended bookings do not count toward the Fair-Usage Threshold.
- (e) No Waiver of Rights. Nothing in this clause limits the Customer’s contractual or statutory rights to purchase extra sessions by separate agreement, nor does it limit either party’s rights under these Terms.

This fair usage clause applies to each site / school in a district contract so if you sign up for 5 unlimited site licences, your fair usage clause is 5x the above school fair usage limit (35,000 tutoring sessions).

## 22. Update

The terms and conditions for our Services may also be found on our website and are available for all prospective and existing users to view at any time.

This agreement is subject to occasional revision, and if we make any substantial changes, we may notify you by sending you an e-mail to the last e-mail address you provided to us (if any), and/or by prominently posting notice of the changes on our site. You are responsible for providing us with your most current e-mail address. In the event that the last e-mail address that you have provided us is not valid, or for any reason is not capable of delivering to you the notice described above, our dispatch of

the e-mail containing such notice will nonetheless constitute effective notice of the changes described in the notice. Any changes to this agreement will be effective upon the earlier of thirty (30) calendar days following our dispatch of an e-mail notice to you (if applicable) or thirty (30) calendar days following our posting of notice of the changes on our site. These changes will be effective immediately for new users of our Services. Continued use of our Services following notice of such changes shall indicate your acknowledgement of such changes and agreement to be bound by the terms and conditions of such changes.

We will not make changes that materially reduce the rights or the data-protection commitments of a paid school or district customer during its then-current subscription term without that customer's consent.

These terms were last updated on 29th June 2026.

## 23. Law

### Entire Terms:

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between you and us regarding the use of the Services. Our failure to exercise or enforce any right or provision of these Terms shall not operate as a waiver of such right or provision. The section titles in these Terms are for convenience only and have no legal or contractual effect. The word "including" means "including without limitation". Neither party is an employee, agent, or partner of the other.

### Choice of Law:

This agreement will be governed by the laws of the United States and the state of Delaware. For public school district customers: the mandatory arbitration, class-action waiver, jury-trial waiver and Delaware governing-law and venue provisions in these Terms apply only to the extent permitted by the laws that govern the district. Where any such provision is prohibited or unenforceable as to the district, disputes will instead be resolved in the state and federal courts, and under the laws, applicable to the district, and the remainder of these Terms will continue in full force.

### Dispute Resolution; Mandatory Arbitration:

Please read this Arbitration Agreement carefully. It is part of your contract with Third Space Learning and affects your rights. It contains procedures for **MANDATORY BINDING ARBITRATION AND A CLASS ACTION WAIVER**.

- (a) Applicability of Arbitration Agreement** - All claims and disputes (excluding claims for injunctive or other equitable relief as set forth below) in connection with the Terms or the use of any product or service provided by Third Space Learning that cannot be resolved informally or in small claims court shall be resolved by binding arbitration on an individual basis under the terms of this Arbitration Agreement. Unless otherwise agreed to, all arbitration proceedings shall be held in English. This Arbitration Agreement applies to you and us, and to any subsidiaries, affiliates, agents, employees, predecessors in interest, successors, and assigns, as well as all authorized or unauthorized users or beneficiaries of services or goods provided under the Terms.

- (b) Notice Requirement and Informal Dispute Resolution** - Before either party may seek arbitration, the party must first send to the other party a written Notice of Dispute (“Notice”) describing the nature and basis of the claim or dispute, and the requested relief. A Notice to Third Space Learning should be sent to: Third Space Learning Inc, 3 Germay Dr, Unit 4 #2810, Wilmington, DE 19804, Attn: Company Secretary. After the Notice is received, you and Third Space Learning may attempt to resolve the claim or dispute informally. If you and Third Space Learning do not resolve the claim or dispute within thirty (30) days after the Notice is received, either party may begin an arbitration proceeding. The amount of any settlement offer made by any party may not be disclosed to the arbitrator until after the arbitrator has determined the amount of the award, if any, to which either party is entitled.
- (c) Arbitration Rules** - Arbitration shall be initiated through the American Arbitration Association (“AAA”), an established alternative dispute resolution provider (“ADR Provider”) that offers arbitration as set forth in this section. If AAA is not available to arbitrate, the parties shall agree to select an alternative ADR Provider. The rules of the ADR Provider shall govern all aspects of the arbitration, including but not limited to the method of initiating and/or demanding arbitration, except to the extent such rules are in conflict with the Terms. The AAA Consumer Arbitration Rules (“Arbitration Rules”) governing the arbitration are available online at [www.adr.org](http://www.adr.org) or by calling the AAA at 1-800-778-7879. The arbitration shall be conducted by a single, neutral arbitrator. Any claims or disputes where the total amount of the award sought is less than Ten Thousand U.S. Dollars (US \$10,000.00) may be resolved through binding non-appearance-based arbitration, at the option of the party seeking relief. For claims or disputes where the total amount of the award sought is Ten Thousand U.S. Dollars (US \$10,000.00) or more, the right to a hearing will be determined by the Arbitration Rules. Any hearing will be held in a location within 100 miles of your residence, unless you reside outside of the United States, and unless the parties agree otherwise. If you reside outside of the U.S., the arbitrator shall give the parties reasonable notice of the date, time and place of any oral hearings. Any judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the arbitrator grants you an award that is greater than the last settlement offer that we made to you prior to the initiation of arbitration, Third Space Learning will pay you the greater of the award or \$2,500.00. Each party shall bear its own costs (including attorney’s fees) and disbursements arising out of the arbitration and shall pay an equal share of the fees and costs of the ADR Provider.
- (d) Additional Rules for Non-Appearance Based Arbitration** - If non-appearance based arbitration is elected, the arbitration shall be conducted by telephone, online and/or based solely on written submissions; the specific manner shall be chosen by the party initiating the arbitration. The arbitration shall not involve any personal appearance by the parties or witnesses unless otherwise agreed by the parties.
- (e) Time Limits** - If you or Third Space Learning pursue arbitration, the arbitration action must be initiated and/or demanded within the statute of limitations (i.e., the legal deadline for filing a claim) and within any deadline imposed under the AAA Rules for the pertinent claim.
- (f) Authority of Arbitrator** - If arbitration is initiated, the arbitrator will decide the rights and liabilities, if any, of you and Third Space Learning, and the dispute will not be consolidated with any other matters or joined with any other cases or parties. The arbitrator shall have the authority to grant motions dispositive of all or part of any claim. The arbitrator shall have the

authority to award monetary damages, and to grant any non-monetary remedy or relief available to an individual under applicable law, the AAA Rules, and the Terms. The arbitrator shall issue a written award and statement of decision describing the essential findings and conclusions on which the award is based, including the calculation of any damages awarded. The arbitrator has the same authority to award relief on an individual basis that a judge in a court of law would have. The award of the arbitrator is final and binding upon you and Third Space Learning.

- (g) Waiver of Jury Trial - THE PARTIES HEREBY WAIVE THEIR CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY RIGHTS TO GO TO COURT AND HAVE A TRIAL IN FRONT OF A JUDGE OR A JURY**, instead electing that all claims and disputes shall be resolved by arbitration under this Arbitration Agreement. Arbitration procedures are typically more limited, more efficient and less costly than rules applicable in a court and are subject to very limited review by a court. In the event any litigation should arise between you and Third Space Learning in any state or federal court in a suit to vacate or enforce an arbitration award or otherwise, **YOU AND THIRD SPACE LEARNING WAIVE ALL RIGHTS TO A JURY TRIAL**, instead electing that the dispute be resolved by a judge.
- (h) Waiver of Class or Consolidated Actions - ALL CLAIMS AND DISPUTES WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THIS ARBITRATION AGREEMENT MUST BE ARBITRATED OR LITIGATED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS AND NOT ON A CLASS BASIS, AND CLAIMS OF MORE THAN ONE CUSTOMER OR USER CANNOT BE ARBITRATED OR LITIGATED JOINTLY OR CONSOLIDATED WITH THOSE OF ANY OTHER CUSTOMER OR USER.**
- (i) Confidentiality** - All aspects of the arbitration proceeding, including but not limited to the award of the arbitrator and compliance therewith, shall be strictly confidential. The parties agree to maintain confidentiality unless otherwise required by law. This paragraph shall not prevent a party from submitting to a court of law any information necessary to enforce this Agreement, to enforce an arbitration award, or to seek injunctive or equitable relief.
- (j) Severability** - If any part or parts of this Arbitration Agreement are found under the law to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such specific part or parts shall be of no force and effect and shall be severed and the remainder of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.
- (k) Right to Waive** - Any or all of the rights and limitations set forth in this Arbitration Agreement may be waived by the party against whom the claim is asserted. Such waiver shall not waive or affect any other portion of this Arbitration Agreement.
- (l) Survival of Agreement** - This Arbitration Agreement will survive the termination of your relationship with Third Space Learning.
- (m) Small Claims Court** - Notwithstanding the foregoing, either you or Third Space Learning may bring an individual action in small claims court.
- (n) Emergency Equitable Relief** - Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may seek emergency equitable relief before a state or federal court in order to maintain the status quo pending arbitration. A request for interim measures shall not be deemed a waiver of any other rights or obligations under this Arbitration Agreement.
- (o) Claims Not Subject to Arbitration** - Notwithstanding the foregoing, claims of defamation, violation of the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act, and infringement or misappropriation of the

other party's patent, copyright, trademark or trade secrets shall not be subject to this Arbitration Agreement.

**(p) Courts** - In any circumstances where the foregoing Arbitration Agreement permits the parties to litigate in court, the parties hereby agree to submit to the personal jurisdiction of the courts located within the state of Delaware for such purpose.

### **30-day Right to Opt Out of Arbitration**

You may opt out of the agreement to arbitrate and the class-action waiver by sending written notice of your decision to opt out within thirty (30) days of first accepting these Terms to [secretary@thirdspacelearning.com](mailto:secretary@thirdspacelearning.com), or by mail to the address in Section 24, stating clearly that you wish to opt out of arbitration and including your (or your organization's) name and the email address associated with your account. If you opt out, all other parts of these Terms continue to apply.

### **Severability:**

If any of the terms in this agreement are held to be unenforceable, invalid or illegal for any reason, the enforceability, validity and legality of the remaining terms of this agreement shall in no way be affected or impaired thereby and will continue in full force.
